YES! provides the foundation of supportive partnerships, educational and employment opportunities, and advocacy so young adults can build positive futures for themselves, their families and their communities.

We envision that every young adult reaches their full personal and career potential and actively contributes to a thriving workforce.

Our Programs:

CareerTREK provides support for young adults to complete their education and gain employment. Funds are available to help meet emergent needs, provide work clothes and equipment, pay for applications and fees, cover parts of tuition or books for school, or used as a paid work experience. **Applications accepted year-round.** To be eligible, you must:

- * be 16-21 years-old
- * qualify as low-income (free lunch recipient, TANF/food-stamps, Pell Grant recipient)
- * have an additional barrier-to-employment (lack of work experience, criminal history, young parent, language barrier)
- * be able to make a long-term commitment to the program, work hard to develop an individual service plan and see it through with our support.

Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP) is a short-term program (July-August) focused on providing work-readiness skills, a paid work experience and covering the costs of work-readiness trainings and skills-based certificate programs. **If funding is continued, applications will be accepted May 1st – June 30th.** SYEP participants are:

- * 16-21 years-old
- * meet the same low-income & barrier-to-employment requirements as CareerTREK.

YouthBuild helps youth who have dropped out of school earn their GED or diploma while gaining hands-on construction experience. Successful applicants are ready to make a drastic step forward in rebuilding their lives by committing to this intensive school-and-work program. Recruitment for the 2010-11 cohort will begin in the spring of 2010. **Applications accepted March 1st – August 25th.** The 2010 program begins in September. Participants are:

- * 17-20 years-old
- * Need their GED or high school diploma
- * low-income, foster youth, child of an incarcerated parent, migrant workers, disabled (IEP), *or* have a criminal history.

Eligibility Documents

Use this page to start gathering the information you'll need to be enrolled in a YES! program. YES! programs are all federally funded and require documentation to prove you are eligible to participate. Before you can be accepted into the program, you must provide proof that you:

- are 16-21 years old
- meet low-income eligibility requirements (see YES! Income Guidelines, next page)
- live in Thurston County
- are registered with Selective Service (if male and 18 or older)
- are a US citizen or non-citizen authorized through Immigration and Naturalization Service

Below is a list of documents that will prove your eligibility. If you have further questions about why these documents are required, or need help getting them together, please contact YES! staff. We will be happy to help you! **If you are applying for YouthBuild, these documents MUST be turned in before an interview can be scheduled!**

YES! Income Guidelines

CareerTREK or Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP) Applicants

You must meet low-income requirements to be eligible for CareerTREK or the Summer Youth Employment Program. In order to be enrolled you must provide proof of income for the past 6 months.

Family Size is determined by the number of people you live with that are related by blood, marriage or court decree.

Your/Family Income and that of your parent/guardian from the last six months is included in your income total. Not included in your income total: child support, work study, unemployment benefits, food stamps, TANF. Most often people provide pay stubs or tax returns to prove income-eligibility. If you need help determining if you meet the income requirement, or understanding what documents can be used, please contact us!

The South Puget Sound YouthBuild project is a recipient of a grant from the US Department of Labor and it is against the law for a recipient of Federal financial assistance to discriminate on the following bases: against any individual in the United States, on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, disability, political affiliation or belief; and against any beneficiary of programs financially assisted under Title I of the Workforce Investment Act of 1998 (WIA), on the basis of the beneficiary's citizenship/ status as a lawfully admitted immigrant authorized to work in the United States, or his or her participation in any WIA Title I-financially assisted program or activity.
